An Encouraging Word

Friendship is one of the most important components in the marriage relationship. While a husband and wife should not merely be friends, they must continue to grow in their friendship in order to maintain a healthy marriage.



When writing about friendship, C.S. Lewis once said, "The very condition of having friends is that we should want something else besides friends ... Friendship must be about something ... Those who have nothing can share nothing; those who are going nowhere can have no fellow-travelers." In other words, friendship is formed around common interests and through journeying together towards common goals.

In order to have a healthy marriage, our relationships must be built on more than just shared hobbies or similar likes and dislikes; we must be walking along the same path towards the same goal.
