An Encouraging Word

As Paul traveled with Silas and Timothy on his second missionary journey, something very interesting happened. This is what Luke records in Acts 16:

6 And they went through the region of Phrygia and Galatia, having been forbidden by the Holy Spirit to speak the word in Asia. 7 And when they had come up to Mysia, they attempted to go into Bithynia, but the Spirit of Jesus did not allow them. 8 So, passing by Mysia, they went down to Troas. 9 And a vision appeared to Paul in the night: a man of Macedonia was standing there, urging him and saying, "Come over to Macedonia and help us." 10 And when Paul had seen the vision, immediately we sought to go on into Macedonia, concluding that God had called us to preach the gospel to them.

Acts 16:6-10



It is interesting to me that the Holy Spirit prevented Paul and his companions from sharing the Gospel in certain areas. That is not an action that we would probably expect from the Holy Spirit, but it was done for the specific reason of calling the missionaries to Macedonia, specifically the city of Philippi. This was a very important calling because it is the first time we see the Gospel brought into Europe.

I think this narrative is important to consider as we answer the question: Where should we witness? The simple answer to that question is, "Everywhere," and in a sense that is correct. But as this story indicates, God has a specific place where he is calling each of us to witness. This morning, I want you to consider two questions. First, where has God currently placed you? You have a unique context that no one else has, and you need to be faithful to witness where you are. Second, is God calling you to go somewhere? We often think that God calls others, but not us. He might be calling you to go on a short-term trip or He might be calling you to move somewhere else, but we must be open to going wherever he calls.

I hope this series has encouraged and challenged you to share the Gospel and I pray that God will bless our efforts as we seek to be His witnesses in Las Vegas and to the end of the earth.
