An Encouraging Word

People are described as sheep throughout the Bible. For example, in Isaiah's prophecy about the Messiah, he states, "All we like sheep have gone astray" (Isaiah 53:6). Also, as Jesus restored Peter and called him to be a leader in the Church, He repeatedly told him, "Feed my sheep" (John 21:15-17). The imagery of sheep describes our human tendency to wander away from God and our need for guidance.

This is why Scripture also often refers to God as a shepherd. David famously referred to God as his shepherd in Psalm 23. Through the prophet Ezekiel, God said, "Behold, I, I myself will search for my sheep and will seek them out" (Ezekiel 34:11). Jesus states that He is the good shepherd "who lays down his life for the



sheep" (John 10:11). The Bible is clear that we need guidance and protection that only God can provide.

This morning we will study a parable that contains a lost sheep and a searching shepherd. Jesus told this parable to describe how much God cares for each person and how He desires for sinners to repent. My hope is that our time in God's Word this morning will help us to gain a better understanding of our Savior's heart. And in response, I pray that sinners will repent and that saints will take up the calling of searching for lost sheep.
