

Home Worship Guide

For the week of March 29

The goal of this home worship guide is to help you focus on God throughout the week and to help you process and apply the sermon from Sunday. The guide is designed to be useful for a single individual, a family, or even multiple households who might want to call, FaceTime, Skype, etc. and go through the guide together.

1. **Opening Prayer Time** – Open in prayer by praising God for who He is and what He has done. Mention specific ways that He has shown His goodness over the past week. Then, confess the times when you have failed to trust Him over the past week and thank Him for His forgiveness.
2. **Worship Time** – Use this link https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=YqWiIp_KLUc to access the song “Come Behold the Wondrous Mystery”. Listen to the song and sing along!
3. **Prayer Time** – Take a moment to pray for all medical professionals, especially members of our church who work in this field. Pray that they will be used by God to display His love and His light in such a difficult time. Pray also that God would keep them healthy and would protect their family members.
4. **Scripture Reading** – Read Psalm 23.
5. **Worship Time** – Use this link https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Mo3HgtT_OiE to access the song “Psalm 23.” Listen to the song and sing along!
6. **Discussion Questions** – These questions are based on Pastor Rob’s sermon from Sunday. If you haven’t listened to the sermon yet, go to our church website and listen to it before answering the discussion questions.

- Pastor Rob mentioned that this was the last week in our series in Genesis. What is something that you have learned through this series? What is something you have applied to your life through this series?
- Pastor Rob pointed out that all people come from the family line of Noah. Why is it important for us to remember that we all come from a common ancestor? How should this affect the way that we think about and treat people?
- Read Genesis 10:25. Remember how Pastor Rob specifically pointed out Eber. Now read Luke 3:35. Note that this is Jesus' genealogy. It's important for us to see that the Bible is not a collection of stories and rules, but it has one overarching storyline that climaxes in the person and work of Jesus Christ. How might keeping this in mind change the way you read the Bible?
- Pastor Rob's closing point this week was, "Don't be a Nimrod!" Nimrod was a man who lived in rebellion against God and chose to live on his own terms rather than trusting and obeying God. When are you most tempted to be a Nimrod? How can you seek to obey God rather than rebel against Him?

7. **Closing Prayer** – Ask God to help you trust Him more and to obey the things that were discussed during this time of worship.
